Our theme this year was "Restoring Relationships" – a focus on re-establishing relationships with our families and in our community now that the global pandemic has ended. Examples of this theme in action were (1) re-introducing our onsite family engagement activities, bringing families back into our centers and resulting in 100% of families surveyed involved in their child's learning; and (2), providing free mental health support and counseling services onsite for employees. We continue to strengthen our program through strengthening our employees, resulting in 90% of LULAC employees surveyed feeling reporting that they feel supported by their supervisors to be successful and committed to our mission.



We continue to provide transformative services to the children, families, and greater community. We continued to develop strong partnerships with local, state and federal agencies, allowing us to further our work towards our mission and to receive recognition from state and federal leaders, including **visits from Congresswoman Rosa DeLauro, Governor Ned Lamont, and OEC Commissioner Beth Bye.** We even had **the first visit to our Head Start Region 1 states by the Director of the Office of Head Start, Khari Garvin.** I received an award by the Office of Head Start for recognition of my early childhood advocacy work. We greatly appreciate the acknowledgment for our innovative programming and show of support to LULAC!

The meaningful work of early childhood education impacts children and their families for many years beyond preschool, and we value our partnerships with families to support children's development with high-quality teachers, a nurturing learning environment, and a research-based curriculum. Our teachers and staff are truly committed to our mission and hard work, and we thank them for helping make LULAC the high-quality program that we are. In addition, we greatly appreciate everyone who supports and partners with us in our efforts to ensure that children and families receive the support they need. 




